Does Love Live at Your House?

Beloved, let us unselfishly love and seek the best for one another, for love is from God; and everyone who loves others is born of God and knows God through personal experience. The one who does not love has not become acquainted with God, does not and never did know Him, for God is love. He is the originator of love, and it is an enduring attribute of His nature.

I John 4:7-8 AMP

Love is a person! God does not just love us, but He is Love. The more of God we have inside of us, the more love we will have towards ourselves and to give away to others. Our tone of voice, facial expressions, body language, and looks also impact our heart and make us feel loved or not. One question I heard years ago that the Holy Spirit keeps reminding me about is, "How would you speak to your spouse or child if you saw that Jesus was standing right behind them?" Ouch! Physical Interactions

Physical touch is one of the most powerful ways that we can express our love or our anger and disapproval towards someone. It is even more amplified if the receiving person's love language is physical touch! Other physical interactions can include disciplining a child, comforting a hurting person, showing affection or acceptance, or offering praise or encouragement, and much more. We can set the atmosphere and temperature of the home by what we say and physically do with each other. The home needs to be a safe place where love abounds and grows between husbands and wives and their children.

Resolving conflicts

This is a place where we really need to have lots of love in our heart and home even before conflicts arise! Conflicts will happen even in the most loving homes just because we are all different and have been influenced by the environments where we grew up. However, there are

ways that we can resolve our differences in love and keep the relationship alive and healthy. Setting priorities
